UPDATE ON THE DIVESTMENT OF THE NCIE PROPERTY AND SERVICES

10 December 2021

The Indigenous Land and Sea Corporation (ILSC) has committed to the divestment of the NCIE property to the NSW Aboriginal Land Council (NSWALC) following two years of extensive discussion and community consultation. As the ILSC will no longer own the NCIE property it will not operate services from the property. Just as the property will transfer to Indigenous ownership, it is time for its services and programs to transfer wherever possible to Indigenous providers.

As part of this, the ILSC has reviewed NCIE services, to consider options for each service moving forward. As a result of this review:

- the Accommodation and Blak Impact service lines will be wound down
- all other services will continue on an ongoing basis at this time supported by NCIE corporate services
- the process of engaging new operators and transitioning services to them is underway, with the intent to complete the transition of all other service lines to new operators by or before 30 June 2022
- other tenants of the site will remain.

What are the next steps?

The Accommodation and Blak Impact service lines will close. The priority focus is on finalising the arrangements for all other programs and services.

Along with the ILSC, NSWALC as the incoming landowner is committed to a transition of these services in a way that preserves staff employment where possible. We anticipate negotiations will be completed early in 2022 and will provide further updates.
